Many smiles were received through this kind gesture in recognizing who he thought had played a great game - on either team, or maybe had just played a tough game and needed a pick-me up, sometimes the most valuable fan received a coin, or someone he felt that could just use a smile.

Don was very thoughtful and never forgot a birthday or holiday. He loved to send cards to his loved ones. He especially loved putting confetti in the cards in the hopes of catching someone unaware and then having a confetti mess to clean up. Yes, Don was a bit of a jokester as well.

Don loved people and especially loved learning about them. He had the gift of gab and

would randomly approach people to learn about the saying on their hat or their shirt or just about anything he could think of just to strike up a conversation.
