Pamela Rodgers of Rangeley, ME, passed on from this life following a lengthy illness on Sunday, July 26 2020. Her departure followed a life well lived, and we are sure she was enthusiastically welcomed by Mom and Dad, Grandparents, and dear friend Diane.
